

The Evolution of New Orleans Drumming

Original Brass Bands - 1870-1900

- Just A Closer Walk With Thee The Original Brass Bands provided the traditional slow funeral march.
- Over In The Glory Land An upbeat musical celebration of life was followed by the 2nd Line marchers.

Blues, Jazz & Swing - 1900-1950

Bourbon Street Parade - The birth of the drum set brought Baby Dodds from the 2nd Line parades to the dance halls.

R&B and Rock'N Roll - 1950-1965

Lucille - Earl Palmer, the father of the backbeat, lays the foundation for modern pop music.

Funk & Latin - 1960-1980

- Hey Pocky A-Way The Meters bring the 2nd Line beat to modern popular music.
- **4** Cissy Strut Joseph "Zigaboo" Modeliste mixes traditional New Orleans grooves and syncopated Latin rhythms into a Funk gumbo.

Modern Brass Bands - 1970-Present

Li'l Liza Jane - Carrying on the New Orleans tradition, the new brass-band movement updated the parading rhythms to the current trends in popular music, modern jazz bebop language and funk.
